## LOCAL RULES

1. Players coming to the tenth tee should drive off alternately with those waiting to begin their round.
2. Out of bounds: outside boundary fences, over boundary hedges and ditches; outside white posts; Park Lake when playing the 8th hole; past fence marking putting green area.
3. Water hazards are identified by yellow markers: i.e. Park Lake when playing the 9th hole.
4. Lateral water hazards are identified by red markers.
5. A ball which is plugged on the fairway may be lifted, cleaned and dropped, not nearer the hole, without penalty. A ball which is plugged on a putting green must be lifted and placed without penalty, not nearer the hole.
6. When Winter Rules are in force (normally 1st November - 30th April), a ball lying on the fairway may, without penalty, be lifted, cleaned and placed within six inches of where it lay, but not nearer the hole. A ball in the rough or semi-rough must be played as it lies.
7. Staked or Wired Trees. If a ball comes to rest so that a staked or wired tree interferes with a player's stance or intended swing, the ball must be lifted, without penalty, and dropped within one club-length of the nearest point of relief (not nearer the hole).
8. All paths, within bounds, are integral parts of the course.
9. Wooden edges of pathways and fixed sprinkler heads are immovable obstructions and relief may be obtained under Rule 24-2.
10. Movable obstructions: stones in bunkers may be removed under Rule 24-1.

## PLEASE NOTE

1. Members should always display a current membership disc on their bag.
2. Two-ball matches, whether singles or foursomes, have priority over three or four-ball matches
3. Be prepared to call faster players through.
4. Be aware of other players on the course. Shout 'Fore!', if they are at risk from your shot.
5. Always carry a pitch mark repairer and expect to use it at every green.
6. Repair **all** divots. Use sand from boxes for repairs on tees.
7. Bunkers should be raked after use.
8. No practising is allowed on the course.
9. Tailored shorts may be worn; short socks must be white and long socks are preferred for men. Jeans, Bermuda shorts and tee shirts are not permitted.
